This year will in all probability be consumed in obtaining charters, and not till 74 need we expect to see the work really commenced. Two years more will be essential for the building, and hence, while the Central and Western will for all that time be in no better position than in the past so far as this matter is concerned, the Southren will enjoy at Amherstburg and possibly also at St Clair, facilities ample for transferring all the cars their road can accommodate.
