DOMINION PARLIAMENT.

Tuesday, May 13th. At the opening of the House, Hon. Mr. Tilley proposed to give notice to go into Committee of the Whole to-day, to consider resolutions for re-adjusting the finances of the Northern Railway, and relieving that undertaking of more than four-fifths of its debt to the Government. With the understanding that full particulars would be printed and brought down promptly, the motion passed.

Hon. Mr. Tilley then gave notice that he would move to-morrow to go into Committee to consider his resolutions granting extra payments to certain contractors on the Intercolonial Railway.

Hon. Mr. Tilley then moved a series of resolutions providing for the readjustment of the public debt. The only reason given by Mr. Tilley for this proposal was that the subsidies allowed to the Province were not now equal in value as compared with 1871, but less by some fifteen or twenty per cent. At the same time the increased value of commodities had raised the amount derivable from taxation.

After some other matters had been disposed of, Mr. Langevin read several letters purporting to be in answer to the charges made against him.

Dr. Abson having formally apologized for non-attendance on the West Waterloo Election Committee.

Mr. Joly, by consent, moved the House into Committee to consider his resolution declaring that no duty should be levied on the manufacture of beet root sugar for ten years.

The motion was carried, reported and concurred in by the House.

The Minister of Marine and Fisheries then presented the third reading of the Fisheries Bill.

Mr. Young (Montreal) moved an amendment in favor of the principle of competition. The amendment was lost on a division.

The third reading was then carried on the 11th inst.

The House went into Committee on the Controverted Election Bill. Some debate took place on the seventh clause, but it finally passed.

Some amendments were made in the Act, and the date for it to come into operation was fixed on the 1st of October 1873, instead of the 1st of January, 1874.

Some other amendments will be proposed on concurrence.

The Militia Act Amendment Bill was considered in Committee, several amendments were suggested, and the Premier at last moved that progress be reported, the probability being that nothing more will be heard of this most objectionable measure.

The Inspection Bill was then considered in Committee. Several Bills were then advanced a stage, and at one o'clock the House adjourned.

Wednesday the 21st inst has at length been the day appointed for the adjournment of the House.

The Government of Bermuda have contracted with Messrs. Lunt, of New York to continue their two steamers, the Albemarle and Hallifax in the New York route, and also to place a larger vessel in the same line.

Mr. Costigan's motion seconded by Mr. Cunningham, to disallow the New Brunswick School Act will come up in the Commons to-day. Ministers will probably make it an open question.
