

THE AYLMER EXPRESS

The Express began publication in October 1879 under the name of the "Aylmer Paper" and took its present name at the start of 1880. The history of the newspaper press in Aylmer is detailed in M. L. Aldrich's POCKET DIRECTORY OF THE TOWN OF AYLMER... April 1888. The founder was T. W. Michael; upon his death in 1885 he was succeeded by his son Bion Michael. By 1890 it had passed to David H. Price, when the extant publishers files begin.
