Dublin, Sept. 21.—The typhoid "scare" at Lettermullen proves to be no exag- pitch-in, in which ten cars were smashed since the days of the corn famines.

Lettermullen is a little island off the coast of Connemara, a bleak patch of the most desolate scenery in Ireland.
Here, on about three miles of almost unbroken ledge, relieved only by dismal moorland and meagre potato patches stuck in among the rocks, live some 120 familles, each with an average of six children. Over-crowding, insanitary surroundings, poverty and a scanty and un-


