

THE LEGISLATURE MUST ACT
ON THE FIXED ASSESSMENTS

The fixed assessment bylaws did not receive a sufficient vote to enable the city council to pass a bylaw granting the assessments.

It will be necessary to go to the Legislature, and by special act, to have them passed.

According to the municipal act, fixed assessment bylaws must receive a two-thirds vote of all the property holders qualified to vote on such bylaws. In case less than one-fifth of the ratepayers vote against the bylaw, a three-fourths vote in favor would be sufficient. The bylaws voted on did not come up to the law in either case.

There were 7,381 entitled to vote on these bylaws. A two-thirds vote would be 4,921. The largest vote cast was that for the McClary Company.

Less than one-fifth, 1,478, voted against the bylaws, and as a result a two-thirds vote of 4,943 would carry them. None received that number, however.

BLIZZARD RAGED
AROUND LONDON

The London and Port Stanley Railway met with very great trouble in operating its trains. The Pere Marquette Railway also had a hard time. The situation around London was very difficult.

The funeral of Mrs. Martha Corsaut, who died very unexpectedly while on a visit here, was held on Saturday from the residence of her brother, lot 5, concession 4, of London Township. The funeral was held at 10 o'clock, and was attended by a large number of friends.
