

VINING TO HEAD UTILITIES FOR 5TH CONSECUTIVE YEAR

Commissioner Returned to
Office on Motion of R. J.
Webster.

SUB-STATION TALK

Pocock Reappointed to Play-
grounds Board, McFarland
to Parks Body.

Commissioner Jared Vining will
head the London public utilities com-
mission as chairman for the current
year.

His selection as chairman of the
commission for the fifth successive
year took place on motion of Com-
missioners R. J. Webster and Philip
Pocock at the inaugural meeting of
the commission yesterday afternoon.
Commissioner Philip Pocock was re-
appointed as chairman of the play-
grounds commission, and likewise
Commissioner T. W. McFarland of
the parks board. Mr. Pocock was
given power to add to his numbers
on the playgrounds commission, Com-

who yesterday was re-elected chair-
man of the London public utilities
commission.

Commissioner R. J. Webster to be a mem-
ber of the committee.
The commission decided to have
the Westinghouse Electric Company
install the electrical equipment pur-
chased from them for the new Car-
ling street sub-station at a cost of
\$4,835. The cost of the equipment
previously purchased by the commis-
sion was \$32,600.

To Purchase Transformers.
The purchase of six 600 kilowatt
regulators of approved type for ap-
proximately \$21,000 from the General
Electric Company for installation in
the new Carling street station was
approved by the commission on mo-
tion of Commissioners Pocock and
McFarland. Delivery of the new
regulators is to be made in three
months' time.

Chairman Vining and Manager E.
V. Buchanan were empowered to pur-
chase 29 transformers for installa-
tion during the coming year. It is likely
that the transformers will be secured
from the General Electric Company at
the rate of \$270 each.
Property-owners of land at the
corner of Oxford and Adelaide
streets, under consideration as a site
for a playground, have since the
city to be bought from funds
bequeathed to the commission by the
late Archie McMahon, appeared in
connection therewith, but since no
agreement could be reached as to the
price, the deal for that particular
piece of property is all off. A com-
munication from Col. Spittal, offer-
ing the old Beecher property for sale,
was referred to the playgrounds com-
mission for a report.

Petition Referred.

City Auditor H. B. Ashplant en-
lightened the commission with regard
to the division of audit costs and gen-
eral discussion upon the subject fol-
lowed. Chairman Vining and Man-
ager Buchanan were empowered to
go into the question more fully with
Auditor Ashplant in the near future.
The petition for the provision of
checkroom accommodation at the
Covers skating rink was referred to
the playgrounds commission, though
the expression of opinion on the sub-
ject was to the effect that, no funds
being on hand, no action could be
taken in the matter.

The G.W.V.A. was granted the use
of Queen's Park on Sunday evenings
during June, July and August for the
purpose of holding band concerts
there.

The recommendation of the parks
board that John Innis be appointed
as professional at the municipal golf
course at Springbank for 1925 was
adopted by the commission.

of the new church, and he appointed
W. Sewell as the rector's warden,

superintendent of the Sunday school,
and Mrs. Clayton will act as organ-

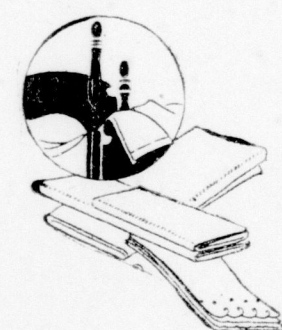
