RAMP RIDING OF LAMBTON.

Meeting of the Liberal Conservative at Watford—Postponement of Nominations—Mr. Fairbanks' Doom Sealed.

A meeting of delegates representing the Liberal Conservatives of the East Riding of Lambton was held yesterday afternoon in the Music Hall at Watford. The attendance was large and influential, every section of the constituency being represented.

Mr. E. McCulloch, President of the Association, presided. In opening the proceedings he explained that the object for which the meeting had been called was, in accordance with a resolution passed at the previous meeting, to nominate a candidate to contest the riding at the next election for the House of Commons. Personally he did not know whether it was a wise thing to bring out a man at the present time to be a target before the Tories and the public for the next fifteen months, although if they do so and he was a new man he might have a chance of getting better acquainted. He believed that had been a time in the history of the riding when the chances of the election of a Conservative were better than at present, for Mr. Fairbanks had gone back a great deal in the opinion of good and loyal people.

Mr. George Shirley, of Brooke, thought it would be premature to nominate a candidate at present, and moved that the nomination be postponed until a day to be selected by the President and Vice-Presidents. For general reasons he urged the advisability of delay, and thought it would be well to allow them to prepare something for the candidate so as to make it smooth sailing for him. They should for the present make every arrangement possible and put their shoulders to the wheel to add every name they could to the list.

Mr. James Kerr, ex-warden of the county, agreed with these remarks. He said a few months ago it seemed as if there was every prospect of a Liberal being precipitated upon them at the election of the crisis, and as if the skillful move of Mr. Blair would be successful, but the aspect of affairs was now altogether different, and everybody had decided in favor of the Government except a few disaffected Reformers in Ontario, and the Government decided that the Government was right on the right question. He believed the result of the election would be a Liberal, and under the circumstances the proper thing was to leave the matter open, and to concentrate the candidate a few months before the election, and then concentrate all their efforts upon the contest.

Mr. George Morcrist, of Petrolia, was of the same opinion, and thought that a few months ago that there was something back of the movement of the Liberal party, and they would have had head enough not to bring upon themselves such a verdict as was given. In fact, for a few moments the Liberal party seemed to lose confidence in the loyalty of Ontario; but they had every reason to feel proud of the result of the election of the 24th, and while they felt proud of those who voted rightly on that occasion, they were disappointed that they had not deserved their sympathy. It was gratifying to see the loyal Reformers giving such a vote to the Liberal party, and it was gratifying to see the loyal members of the county, who came down to the House, stung into political activity by their representation, and at the peril of his health, to give a loyal vote. Mr. Frank Smith, of Petrolia, believed that the Liberal party was a good party, and that when he returned from Ottawa he would surely see the error he had made, and that he would not accept the nomination. He thought it would not be wise to nominate a candidate at present, and he would expose him to the standards and the party who know so well how to do all that was honorable. They were not prepared to nominate their candidate at present, but when they did so it certainly was their duty to support a man who could do sufficient pluck to support a man who could work well and who could properly represent them and their interests on the floor of the House. He hoped they would thoroughly organize and show Mr. Fairbanks the great mistake he had made since they set out on Ottawa.

After a few more of the delegates had expressed their opinions, a vote was taken and the motion to postpone the nomination was carried by a large majority.

It was also decided to take proper action in regard to the forthcoming Court of Revision, and the meeting closed.
