Paris, March 29—There has been a correspondence between Bismarck and the Central-Committee of Paris, the latter representing that the Thiers Government was unsupported by the country and the election of a new assembly became necessary; the committee offered meanwhile to pay in a few days the instalments of the indemnity due to the Germans. 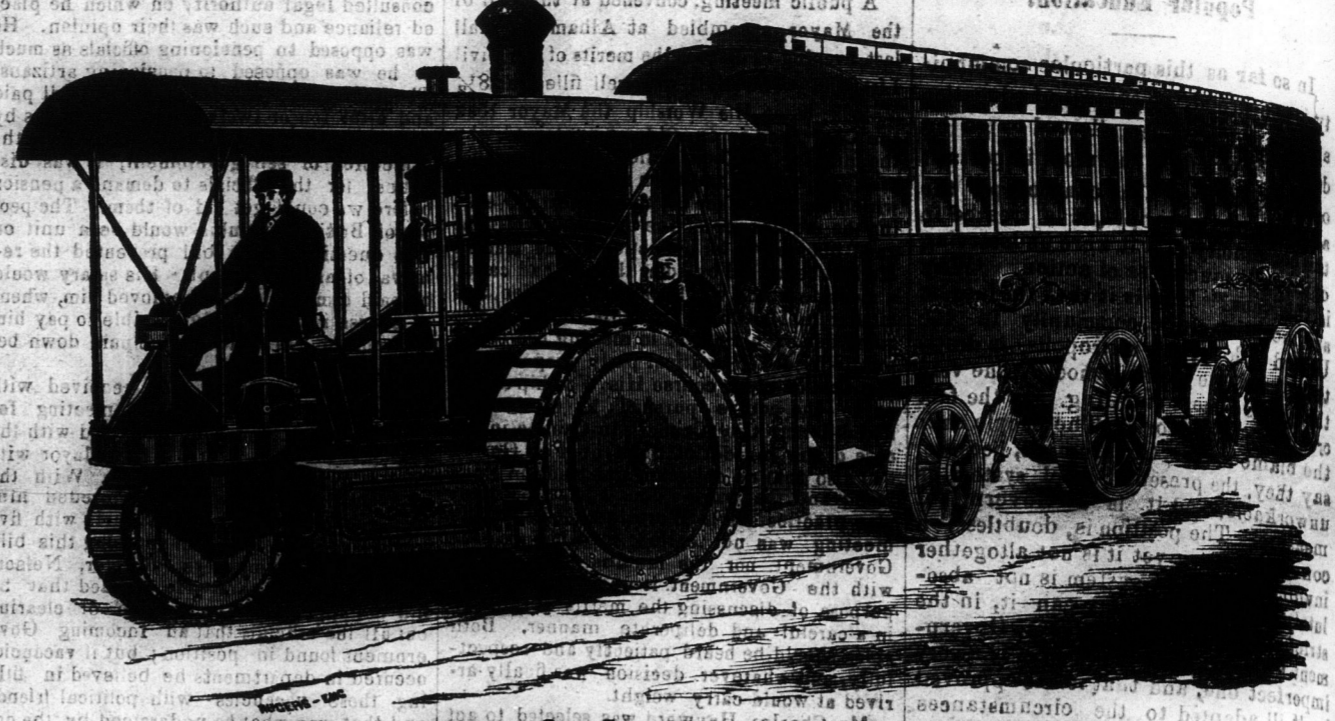
