Trying to Pass Each Other on the Sam About 2.30 yesterday morning two G. T. R. About 2.30 yesterday morning two G. T. R. freight trains, one a regular from Hamilton and the other a special from Toronto, collided at Clarkson statiou, a mile or so from Lorne Park. Both engines were completely wrecked, and a dozen cars were more or less wrecked. Engineer McClarty of the train coming east had his shoulder dislocated by falling when he jumped clear of the engine, and two other train men were slightly injured. Except this nobody suffered injury. Both trains had their cars loaded, and the damage to rolling stock and freight cannot be less than \$40,000. Traffic from the west was considerably delayed, and it was not until about 12 that anything like a free passage could be had for trains. In the collision Mr. Geo. F. Bostwick had a car load of safes for the Exhibition. The car is badly wrecked, the safes being all out of it, mixed up with cattle and other debris. Mr. Bostwick is going out on the first train, and will make every effort to have the safes recovered from the wreck and have them at the Exhibition notwithstanding the injury that has been dear them. e injury that has been done them.

Montreal Must Pay for the Accident. Montreal, Sept. 6.—Judge Mathieu gave adgment to-day in the cases of J. B. Cadaret v. the City, and A. P. Vanasse, et al., v. the City. It will be remembered that when Cardinal Taschereau visited Montreal two years ago an arch erected by the city at the foot of Jacques Cartier-square broke down, killing, as old lady, Mrs. Vanasse, and severely injuring her niece, Miss Cadaret. The children of Mrs. Vanasse claimed \$5000 damages and the father of Miss. Oadaret \$200. The court held the city responsible, and rendered judgment for the full amount claimed by Cadaret but reduced the claim of Mrs. Vanasse's heirs to \$1000.

She arose and is now doing well and walking about nicely.

The babe was well wrapped up in light flannel clothes and the appearance of being pretty well cared for.
