THE GODERICH SCANDAL

THE CHARGES AGAINST M. CAMERON
ARE INVESTIGATED.

The statements of those who charge him with improper conduct and Mr. Cameron's denial of the charges are set forth in this special issue of the Star.

The world this morning lays before its readers a kind of matter that it would be hard to present to them unless grave reasons existed for doing so. It is a matter that should be known by all who are interested in the conduct of the Government.

On July 10 the world reproduced from the columns of The Goderich Star an editorial article commenting on the conduct of Mr. Cameron in the House of Commons.

This was the case of M. Cameron against one R. J. K. Gore. Mr. Cameron, a well-known public man, was indicted by a grand jury for the offence of having been guilty of a conspiracy to defraud the Government.

The action was stopped for certain reasons and the editor of the Star informed that the Government had decided to discontinue the prosecution of the case.

Under these circumstances and two threats of criminal proceedings, the world determined to publish the full story of the case.

According to your instructions I visited Goderich Wednesday last to enquire into the charges of immorality preferred against Mr. M. Cameron, ex-M.P., and the results of my investigation.

His legal adviser, Mr. Garrow, is also said to have stated on the public that Mr. Cameron had been charged with the crime of having been guilty of a conspiracy to defraud the Government.

Mr. Cameron's Denial. "Does anybody not know," said he, "that the Department of the Postmaster-General is notorious from one end of Canada to the other? No notorious has it become that it has been the object of the public mind from almost every point in the land."
