

CARETAKERS' SALARIES

Discussed At the Meeting of the Separate School Board.

The regular meeting of the Separate School Board was held last evening in the board room of the De La Salle Institute, Rev. Father Rooney, V.G., in the chair. Those present were Rev. Dean McCann, Fathers Rohleder, Cassidy and McCarthy and Messrs. James Ryan, C. P. Long, John O'Connor, M. Walsh, Gen. St. Boniface, Charles Burns, M. O'Connor and T. W. Anglin.

A communication was received from P. C. Cribben, secretary of the Trades and Labor Council, extending an invitation to the members of the Separate School Board to take part in the coming demonstration on Sept. 10. The invitation was accepted.

A communication was received from the City Clerk asking the opinion of the board in connection with teaching the children the use of life preservers, which are placed on all vessels. The communication was laid over.

The reports of the Finance and Sites and Buildings Committees were received and adopted.

When the report of the Printing and Supplies Committee came up exception was taken to the increasing of the salaries of the caretakers. The chairman of the committee, Mr. Charles Burns, fully explained why the salaries should be increased and the report was adopted. The appointment of a caretaker for St. Helen's school was left in the hands of Rev. Father Cassidy.

A bill for cartage was presented, but it was contended that it was brought in through the Finance Committee, so it was laid over till the next meeting.

It was moved by Mr. Burns, seconded by Mr. Burns, that the assistant secretary be instructed to ascertain if it is true that the members of the Public School Board receive tickets for the fair, and if so why do not the members of the Separate School Board receive the same? Carried.

After some discussion for relieving the overcrowding of St. Patrick's school the meeting adjourned.

Change in Street Railway Routes.
During the Exhibition the following changes will be made in the running of the routes, viz.:

The Queen and High Park and Queen and Brookton cars coming east will run down York to Front, along to and up Yonge to Queen, thence along Queen as usual. Extra cars will be put on this route to run down Dufferin-street to the Exhibition grounds.

The North Toronto and Union Station cars will run from the terminus at North Toronto down Yonge to Bloor, across to and down Church to Front, and along the Union Station, returning the same way. The Yonge-street cars will run between the Union Station and the terminus at the Exhibition grounds.

The Bell Line cars will run both ways in Sherbourne, Bloor, Spadina, and Queen, York and King.

Woodbine and Lake Avenue cars will run from the East End to the Union Station via King, Church and Front.

The Winchester and Parliament cars will run from their respective eastern termini to the Union Station via Queen, Church and Front.

Cars will run in Bathurst-street between the C.P.R. tracks and King-street, transferring to King-street cars.

During the Exhibition transfer tickets will be given to passengers by transfer agents at the following intersections: In King-street at Church, Yonge, York and Bathurst; in Queen at Yonge, McCaul and Spadina; at College and Spadina and Yonge and College intersections.
