CHICAGO WHEAT IS WEAKER

THE INCREASE IN VISIBLE LARGER THAN EXPECTED.

Wall Street Markets Are Irregular. Closing Firm—Canadian Securities Generally Are Steadier—Provisions Lower at Chicago—Local Stocks of Grain—Latest Commercial News.

Monday Evening, Nov. 19. Local securities are steadier. Consols are unchanged closing today at 102 7/8 for money and account.

Canadian Pacific is very weak, closing in London today at 62 and in New York at 60 1/4. St. Paul closed in London at 61 3/8, N. Y. C. at 103 1/2, Erie at 113 7/8 and Reading at 8 5/8.

Demand sterling exchange is 1-04 higher at New York.

The gold in the United States Treasury amounts to \$61,684,000, as compared with \$78,000,000 a year ago and \$124,000,000 two years ago.

The amount of wheat afloat to Europe is 27,456,000 bushels, an increase of 610,000 bushels for this week over the amount afloat was 32,080,000 bushels.

Corn afloat to Europe 2,480,000 bushels, an increase of 352,000 bushels for the week.

English farmers' deliveries of wheat last week amounted to 40,376 quarters; average price, 19s. 1d. The English visible decreased 642,000 bushels.

Imports into the United Kingdom the past week: Wheat, 262,000 qrs.; maize, 87,000 qrs., and flour, 237,000 barrels.

At Oswego Canadian barley is firmer at 62c. Receipts from the past week were 37,920 bushels. Stock in store 350,000 bushels.
