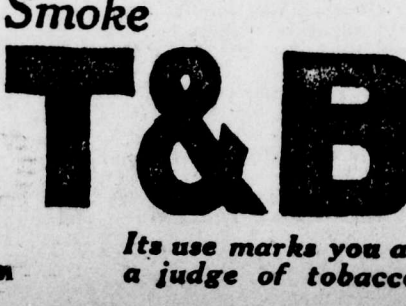

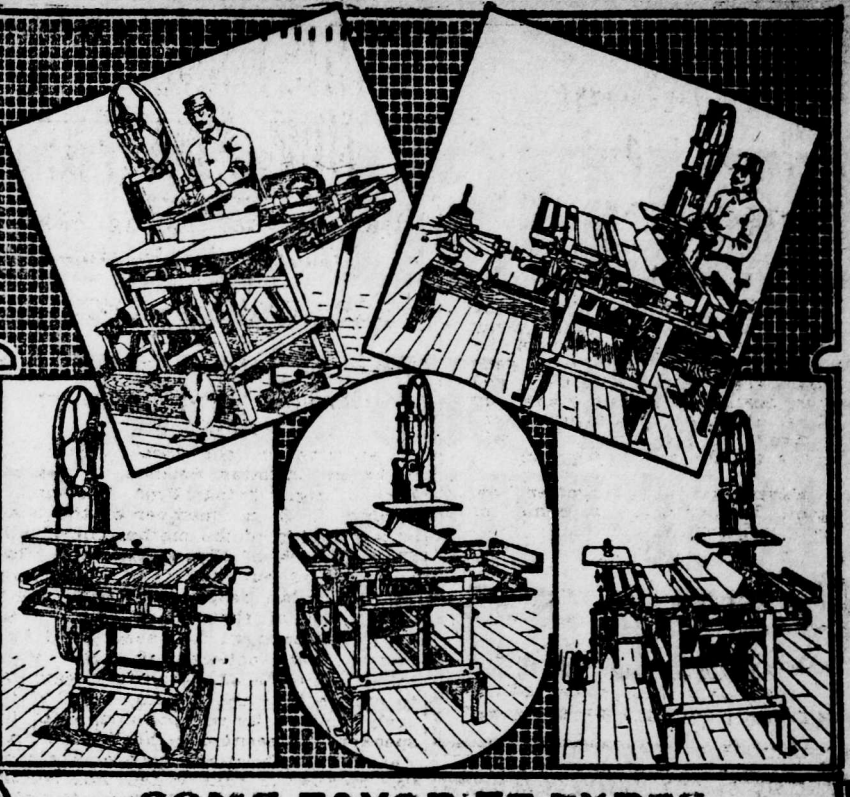

MORMONS IN CANADA

Nephi Jensen, former Utah lawyer, now president of the Canadian mission, has frequently been asked by Canadian newspapers why his church has established a mission in Canada. In answer to these questions Mr. Jensen has given out the following statement:

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, nicknamed the Mormon Church, is a divine institution, having been established pursuant to divine revelation from Jesus Christ.

She is the only church to-day which bears the full true name of the Son of God.

She is invested with divine authority, her two first elders having been ordained to the holy priesthood and apostleship in 1829 by Peter, James and John, who came to this earth for the express purpose of bestowing this authority to act in the name of the Son of God.

She exemplifies all the miraculous gifts of the Holy Ghost, healing by faith, miracles, visions, tongues, revelation and prophecy.

We teach the fullness of the pure Christianity of Christ's time. We uphold the real personality and true Fatherhood of God. We proclaim the divine Sonship and redeeming power of the Christ. We teach the doctrine of the Trinity, that the Father, and the Son and the Holy Ghost are three distinct persons, who are one in purpose.

We teach the New Testament doctrine of salvation. We declare that through the atonement of the Christ all mankind may be saved by obedience to the laws and ordinances of the Gospel. With the Christ and the ancient apostles we hold that living faith in Jesus Christ must be followed by genuine repentance, baptism for the remission of sins and the laying on of hands for the gift of the Holy Ghost.

We are absolutely alone in the proclamation and practice of the principles of salvation for the dead, which is an inseparable part of the true Gospel. We testify that Elijah, the prophet, in fulfillment of Malachi's prophecy (Mal. 4) came to this earth in 1828 and reinstated with him the law of sacrifice, which was practiced by the former day saints (1. Cor. 15, 29).

We are earnestly and energetically making preparation for the second coming of the Christ. We testify that the angel that John saw "flying through the midst of heaven" (Rev. 14, 6) came to this earth in 1837 and delivered to our first prophet the everlasting Gospel which the Christ had preached to his father's sheep. (John 1). We are preaching this restored Gospel to prepare a people for the Millennium.

The Latter Day Saints, who have received this restored Gospel, exemplify their lives in holiness and integrity. They have developed the highest standard of living known to modern man. They have developed to the highest the following five essentials to the highest civilization:

- 1.—HEALTH AND CLEAN BLOOD—Dr. A. W. Evans, a noted hygienist, in The Chicago Tribune, said: "Of all the states Utah has the highest birth rate, the lowest death rate and the least disease among babies. Going back to 1917, in order to get away from the abnormal conditions brought about by influenza, I find that Utah had a death rate of 10.2, as compared with 14.2 for the country at large."
- 2.—INDUSTRY AND PROSPERITY—They are home makers and home owners. A larger percentage of them own their own homes than any other people in the world. McLean's, a Canadian magazine (December 1, 1920, page 73), says: "My own experience with the Mormons is that they were industrious, hard working, sober people. The boys are helpful and the girls are modest."
- 3.—EDUCATION—Mrs. W. E. Groves, of the Toronto Board of Education, in The Toronto Evening Telegram, July 23, 1920, page 11, says: "Utah is the only state that has attempted to eliminate illiterates from 12 to 18 through the public schools. It has succeeded in doing so within a hailing distance of Utah in an efficient attempt to solve the civic, industrial and educational problems of the youth from 12 to 18."
- 4.—MORALITY—Henry Ward Beecher is quoted in McLean's, a Canadian magazine (December 1, 1920, page 73), as saying: "Their (the Mormons) young men are the most moral in the world. Col. Theodore Roosevelt, in Collier's Magazine, February, 1911, said: "Indeed, among these Mormons the standard of sexual morality was unusually high."
- 5.—SPIRITUALITY—William Jennings Bryan, at the close of the Mormon Conference in Salt Lake City, April, 1920, upon a session of which he attended, was quoted in the newspapers as saying: "I have never witnessed such spirituality in my life."
