BOSANQUET COUNCIL.

Council met on Oct. 7th. All the members present. Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.

Caleb Travis and James Gibson were accepted as the Collector's bondsmen.

Communications were received from Meredith & Meredith in reference to a road across George Carrother's lot; from The Canada Co. Commissioners re road across a town plot in Port Frank, and requesting the Council to appoint one or more members of the Council to meet the representatives of the Company to adjust this matter if possible, and from Mr. Palmer, Indian Agent, in reference to grading and graveling the Lake Road in front of Stoney Point Reserve. No action on either communication.

A by-law was passed to raise \$12 from the lands and roads in Bosanquet assessed for the McPherson drain to pay for work on the outlet in the Township of Warwick.

The Clerk was instructed to notify A. S. Code to be present at next meeting of the Court of Revision on the Clark-Humphries drain.

An account for \$14 was presented by J. H. Powell for four days' graveling on the 6th con. No action.

Loughheel-Melville, that the following orders be given:—Wm. Bryant, \$10.32, publishing Clark-Humphries drain by law and postage, and \$1.75 for supplies, and the Clerk \$10 for by-laws and \$7 postage and \$14 to pay selection of jurors.

McIntyre-Sitter:—\$40 in favor of N. J. Kearney, Treasurer Bosanquet Ag'l Society; \$20 in favor of C. W. McCordic, Treasurer Forest Ag'l Society; Sarnia Bridge Co. \$115.00 for steel for bridge over Mill Creek, con. 8; John Melville \$100 part payment building bridge con. 8; Mrs. Stevenson \$31.95 for gravel; Wm. Bryant \$1 ad. for tenders Russell drain; Hamilton & Prout \$300.12 for cement, plank and lumber.

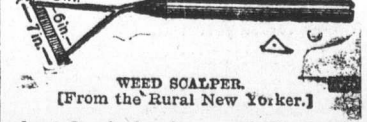

"SCALPER" FOR WEEDS.

Homemade Tool That Does Good Work Around Sweet Potatoes, Onions, Etc.

This "scalper" for weeds is a simple affair and can easily be made by any blacksmith in a short time, and the cost, aside from the handle, need not exceed 20 cents. It is made of an iron rod about twenty-four inches long and three-sixteenths to one-fourth of an inch in diameter. This rod is bent in the form of a triangle and the two ends welded together so as to go in an ordinary hoe handle. Before bending, however, six inches in the center of the rod (afterward the base of the triangle) should be heated and pounded out to make a flattened surface at least one-half inch wide with a slight bevel so that one side will be sufficiently thin to make a reasonably sharp edge.

Measure one-half inch on either side of the flattened surface or blade and bend from these two points so as to form the triangle with the blade as the base. The sides of the triangle are

about five inches long, and this leaves two ends of three and a half inches to be bent together, forming the shank. When inserting in a handle the scalper is bent at the shank so as to make a slight angle with the handle. The scalper is the lightest and most efficient tool we have for working in sweet potatoes. With it even green hands can do fairly good work with little injury, as the plant is protected from the two extremes of the blade or cutting edge by the rounded corners made by the unsharpened rod. The scalper takes the place of a hoe everywhere except in heavy soil or where soil must be pulled up to the hill. Although used mainly for sweets, we find it valuable for working in strawberries, cabbage, onions, watermelons, cantaloupes, etc., and it proves a great help in a fight against grass and weeds.—Rural New Yorker.
