**REPORT ON DAIRY  
CATTLE RECORDS**

Great Increase in the Animals  
Admitted to the Record of  
Performance

At the annual meetings of the  
Ayrshire and Holstein-Friesian Breed-  
ers' Associations in 1920 it was de-  
cided to add to the Record of Per-  
formance a 305-day record with a  
four hundred day calving limit and  
to cut out the calving requirement  
in the 365-day record. This arrange-  
ment came into effect on April 1st,  
1920, and this classification therefore  
appears in the thirteenth report of  
the Record of Performance for Pure  
Bred Dairy Cattle, covering the year  
from that date to March 31st, 1921,  
recently issued by the Live Stock  
Branch at Ottawa. From this report  
it appears that, in all, 329 Ayrshires  
were entered, of which 127 were in  
the mature class, 3 being in the 205-  
day division, 35 in the 4-year-old class,  
one being in the 305-day division, 70  
in the 3-year-old class, three in the  
305-day division, and 97 in the two-  
year-old class. The 205-day division  
in Ayrshires is termed the Honor  
Roll. The number of Holsteins en-  
tered was 385, of which 129 were in  
the mature class, including 3 in the 305-  
day division, 57 in the 4-year-old  
class, 59 in the 3-year-old class, one  
being in the 305-day division, and 129  
in the 2-year-old class with two in  
the 305-day division. The Jerseys  
entered numbered 139, namely, 28  
mature, 21 four-year-olds, 39 three-  
year-olds and 57 two-year-olds. The  
Shorthorns entered totalled 102, name-  
ly, 40 mature, 12 four-year-olds, 20  
three-year-olds, and 30 two-year-olds.  
Of French-Canadian cattle 8 mature,  
3 three-year-olds and one two-year-  
old were recorded. Of Guernseys, 4  
mature, one four-year-old and 6 two-  
year-olds proved eligible. Every  
breed shows an increase in the total  
number of entries over the previous  
year. Ayrshires of 150, Holsteins of  
160, Jerseys of 84 and Shorthorns of  
59. Perhaps the best indication of  
the growth of the Record of Per-  
formance system for pure-bred dairy  
cattle is to be found in the fact that  
336 breeders are represented in the  
thirteenth report against 247 in the  
twelfth.

seed is apt to hull easily in thresh-  
ing, the result, of course, being the  
appearance of a certain percentage  
of hulled grains in the threshed seed.  
In other instances the presence of  
hulled seed is due to the fact that  
the timothy crop contains a number  
of plant types which are character-  
ized by hulling easily. It has been  
shown that there exist timothy forms,  
representing distinct varietal types,  
which lose the hull in threshing  
much more easily than others.

Whatever the cause of the hulling  
may be, the presence of hulled seed  
in large quantities in a sample is  
lowering its trade value, it being  
generally conceded that hulled seed  
is apt to show a poorer germination  
than unhulled seed. While this is  
hardly true of freshly harvested seed,  
it certainly does apply to old seed,  
as has been repeatedly demonstrated  
long ago. As a result of the impaired  
germination, lower-yielding crops are  
likely to be obtained from seed which  
contains much hulled grain.

In the spring of 1917, the Central  
Experimental Farm, Ottawa, received  
from the Seed Branch, Dominion  
Department of Agriculture, two lots  
of timothy seed, viz., one sample of  
hulled seed and another lot of un-  
hulled seed, both picked out from a  
seed sample harvested in 1916. Small  
portions of the two lots have been  
sown yearly in comparative test plots  
at the Central Experimental Farm,  
care being taken that the plots were  
as identical as possible in respect to  
condition of the soil.

The hay yields per acre from the  
hulled and the unhulled seed harvest-  
ed 1916 and sown 1919 and 1920 re-  
spectively, have been as follows.

Unhulled Seed:—Sown 1919, 2 ton  
840 lbs.; sown 1920, 2 ton 1254 lbs.  
Hulled Seed:—1 ton 1375 lbs.; 2 ton  
53 lbs.

From these figures the deduction  
may be made that hulled seed, 3 or  
4 years old, is likely to produce a  
much smaller hay crop than unhulled  
seed of the same age. Under the  
circumstances it is obvious that  
timothy seed holding only a small  
percentage of hulled seed is always  
preferable to seed containing a larger  
percentage and that, if badly hulled  
seed is the only one available, it is  
good policy to have a sample tested  
or germination before sowing and to  
increase the rate of seeding in pro-  
portion to the percentage of hulled  
germination.

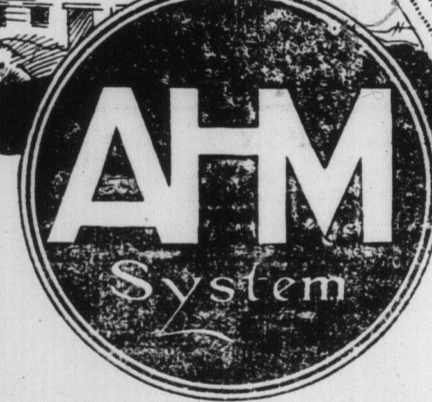
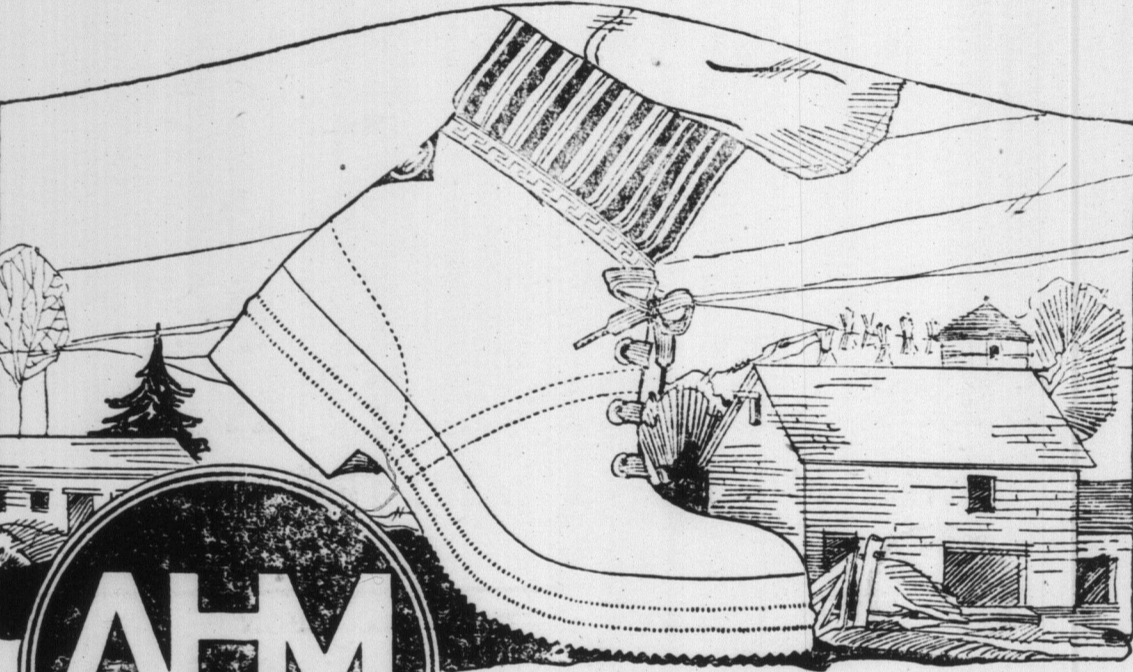

**HULLED VS. UNHULLED  
SEED OF TIMOTHY**

(Experimental Farms Note)

Practically every sample of timothy  
seed contains more or less of so-called  
hulled seed, that is to say naked  
grains which have lost their silvery-  
white hull. There are several causes  
which are responsible for the loss of  
the hull in timothy seed, the most  
common ones perhaps being unfavor-  
able weather conditions during har-  
vesting time and delay in cutting  
until the seed is too ripe. Over-ripe

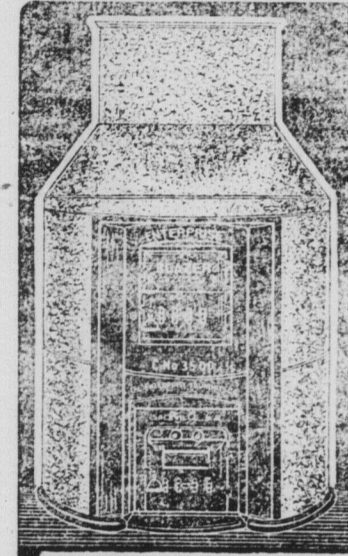
