

HULLED VS. UNHULLED SEED OF TIMOTHY

(Experimental Farms Note)

Practically every sample of timothy seed contains more or less of so-called hulled seed, that is to say naked grains which have lost their silverywhite hull. There are several causes which are responsible for the loss of the hull in timothy seed, the most common ones perhaps being unfavorable weather conditions during harvesting time and delay in cutting until the seed is too ripe. 
