Tenth course W. by S. 40 chains.

Nothing remarkable.

Eleventh course W. 30 chains

A barren steep bank and stone shore all this course.

Twelfth course W. by N. 250 chains.

THE river runs near the bank which is barren, the shore stony. At 210 chains is a creek with some timber in it. The end of this course abreast of Seal-island.

Thirteenth course W. half S. 160 chains.

Sixty chains up this course is a creek, where there is a large quantity of timber-trees. Here is a long fall or stream of water, where captain Fowler and I sailed up in a long-boat, and turned back when we were almost up it.

Fourteenth course W. S. W. 180 chains.

Runs into a Bay, but the river lyeth W. half S. five miles up from Gillam's-illand. At the end of this course is a creek, where is a good quantity of timber.

Fifteenth course N. W. 210 chains.

THE third fall or stream of water.

Sixteenth course W. by N. 560 chains.

At the beginning of this course on the north fide just above a point, is an island as large as Gillam's. Sixty chains higher are four islands, three
