

BOOK THE THIRD.

TRANSACTIONS AT TWO SPANISH SETTLEMENTS IN NEW ALBION; EXAMINATION OF COLUMBIA RIVER; OCCURBENCES ON BOARD THE DÆDALUS; SECOND VISIT TO THE SANDWICH ISLANDS.

CHAPTER I.

THURSDAY morning, Nov. 15th, we difcovered our anchorage to be in a most excellent small bay, within three sourths of a mile of the nearest shore, bearing by compass south; one point of the bay bearing N. 56 W., the other S. 73 E. the former at the distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$, the latter about 3 miles.
