 SIONS.**—The Rev. Mr. McKee, a missionary of
 the Irish Church, mentions that the Rajah of
 Bawannuggur, one of the chief princes of Katia-
 war, sent, on the day of his coronation, one hun-
 dred rupees for the poor of Gogo, and for the mis-
 sion and schools; and still more recently, re-
 quested Mr. McKee to procure for him, from
 Bombay, some good books in the Undee language.
 This proves that Missionary efforts are begin-
 ning to be appreciated by the native princes—
 Similar to this, is the fact announced in the Irish
Missionary Herald, that the uncle of the King
 of Persia, a man of great influence in the country,
 has become an annual subscriber of one hundred
 dollars to the American Board of Missions.
