A DAINTY. BREAKFAST DISH.—To cold corned or roast beef, minced and freed from gristle and strings, add an equal quantity of mashed or sliced boiled totato. Mix well together, and senson with pepper and salt. Put into a frying pan a large cupful of boil-ing water, with half as much gravy from which the fat has been skimmed, and a teaspoonful of made mustard. If you have no gravy, substitute soup stock or a cupful of soup left over from the day before. Boil up briskly before stirring in the chopped meat and potato. Toss and stir until the contents of the pan are a bubbling, smoking heap: Be careful that the hash is not too stiff. Add more boiling water should the meat and potato absorb the liquid too rapidly, and do not let the hash stick to the bottom of the pan. The country housekeeper who has spoonful of made mustard. Delicious Rhubarb Jam. — To six pounds of inharb add six pounds of lump sugar and six large lemons; cut the rhubarb into small pieces about the size of a walnut; then the lemons should be sliced and the peel cut very fine.
