DEATH OF FRANK P. GRANT.

N Tuesday, May 3, died Frank Parker Grant, artist, at the early age of twenty-five years. He had come to Toronto last July from Halifax, a happy bridegroo. In less than a year death overlook him. Sadder still, his young wife joined him in the great beyoud five days later, unconscious in life of her husband's There remains of this brief wedded life an infant daughter less than a month old.

The shock of his death followed go swiftly by that of his wife, has oppressed all those who were brought into touch with them. They were possessed of a large share of amiability and culture, and the lives of both were rich with the promises of better
