HIDES .- Very little in the way of news can be gleaned in this line of trade. Receipts of green hides are fair in quantity, with the demand just about absorbing the supply. Dealers are paying the usual 5c. per lb. for No. 1 green, and selling to tanners at 51c. The few caffekins offering bring 5c. per lb.; lambskins 75c. each.

LEATHER.—Though the local market is dull, there are some considerable shipments of splits going forward to England, and local values in this line are steadier, though quotations cannot be altered.
