## ARTICLE 1

The Government of Canada agrees to make available to the Government of the United States of America the following communication facilities over the telephone and telegraph lines, owned by the Government of Canada, and located along the Alaska Highway in Canada, between Edmonton, Alberta, and the border of the territory of Alaska and Canada:—

A. for voice frequency only,

(a) Two channels, Edmonton to the said border,

(b) Two channels, Whitehorse to the said border,

(c) One channel, Whitehorse to Edmonton.

B. for standard teletype frequency only, addison most event of the

(d) Two channels, Edmonton to the said border, manufacture bas notice

(e) Three channels, Whitehorse to said border.

The Government of the United States of America shall pay the Government of Canada for the use of the said communication facilities the sum of \$271,00 in United States funds, for the year commencing April 1, 1947. Payments sha in future be made in equal monthly instalments but payment for the period from April 1, 1947 to February 29, 1948, shall be paid in one instalment forthwite upon the conclusion of this agreement.

The Government of the United States of America agrees to pay for the <sup>15</sup> of such additional communication facilities as may be required by the <sup>30</sup> Government and as may otherwise be available for use, at such rates and charge as are adopted as standard in respect of the telephone and telegraph lines locate along the Alaska Highway in Canada.

The Government of Canada agrees to credit the Government of the Unite States of America for reductions and readjustments of facilities in accordance with the prevailing rates that are adopted as standard in respect of the telephon and telegraph lines located along the Alaska Highway in Canada, provided the the total annual aggregate payments by the Government of the United States America do not fall below the amount of \$271,000 per annum above stated.

The two Governments agree that the said communication facilities betwee Edmonton, Alberta, and the Alaska-Canada border, which are a continuation and connected with similar communication facilities owned by the Governme of the United States of America and extending from the said border to Fairbank Alaska, are capable of use and operation only if, when and to the extent that communication facilities owned by the Government of the United States America and located in Alaska as aforesaid, are simultaneously maintained use and operation and are available.

It is further agreed between the said Governments that payments reserve under Article 2 hereof shall accrue only if and to the extent that the community tion facilities made available hereunder by the Government of Canada properly maintained for use and operation.
