THE PROGRESS MADE ON THE PERT ISSUE IS ALSO ENCOURAGING - PARTICULARLY, THE RECENT ACCORD ACHIEVED BY MEXICO AND ITS COMMERCIAL CREDITORS. HOWEVER, THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY MUST CONTINUE TO SEARCH FOR CREATIVE SOLUTIONS TO THE PERT CRISIS.

AS THE ECONOMIC CIRCUMSTANCES IMPROVE, I RELIEVE THAT CANADA, HAVING MAINTAINED ITS MARKET SHARE OVER THE LAST FIVE YEARS IN SPITE OF THE REGIONAL DECLINE IN IMPORTS, IS WELL-PLACED TO CAPITALIZE ON NEW OPPORTUNITIES.

WE HAVE THE ADVANTAGE OF A LONG TRADITION OF INVOLVEMENT IN THE REGION: ATLANTIC CAMADA HAS HAD STRONG TRADE LINKS WITH THE CARIBBEAN SINCE THE 18TH CENTURY AND CAMADIAN ENGINEERING EXPERTISE PROUGHT FLECTRICITY TO BRAZIL IN THE LATE 1800'S, TO CITE JUST TWO OF MANY EXAMPLES.

WE HAVE GOOD POLITICAL RELATIONS WITH OUR HEMISPHERIC NEIGHBOURS AND ARE SEEN AS A WILLING, INTHREATENING AND ABLE PARTNER IN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.
