PRAYERS

On motion of Mr. McCleave, seconded by Mr. Béchar, the First Report of the Standing Joint Committee on Regulations and other Statutory Instruments, presented to the House on Tuesday, October 29, 1974, was concurred in.

Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Report of the Superintendent of Insurance for Canada—Co-operative Credit Societies for the year ended December 31, 1973. (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 301-1/114.

Ordered,—That the House proceed to the consideration of the motion concerning the Veterans Land Act, of which notice was given on Thursday, October 17, 1974, when Orders of the Day are called on Tuesday next and, if necessary, on Wednesday next; and

That, the hour for Private Members' Business on Tuesday next be suspended.

The honourable Member for Oshawa-Whitby (Mr. Broadbent), from his place in the House, asked leave under Standing Order 26 to move the adjournment of the

House for the purpose of discussing a specific and important matter requiring urgent consideration, and stated the subject to be: "the crisis in the meat producing industry manifested by the destruction of calves in Quebec and the high prices being paid by consumers throughout Canada".

And leave having been granted to propose a motion to adjourn the House in order to discuss the matter, the motion to adjourn was allowed to stand over until 8.00 o'clock p.m. this day.

The Order being read for the second reading and reference to a Committee of the Whole of Bill C-32, An Act to impose a charge on the export of crude oil and certain petroleum products, to provide compensation for certain petroleum costs and to regulate the price of Canadian crude oil and natural gas in interprovincial and export trade;

Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale), seconded by Mr. Jamieson, moved,—That the Bill be now read a second time and referred to a Committee of the Whole.

And debate arising thereon; the debate was adjourned.
