

years' contributions, or to do so if they are not
convinced it is worth contributing to the war.
While the losses of participation are little, the
losses of rights are serious. II

Admittedly, the drafting tax participation rate
depends on legislation at the time. IV
However, let us consider a hypothetical situation
in which Congress passes a bill that would
allow a family to deduct up to \$1000 in
war contributions from their tax bill. If
the bill were to pass, it would be logical
to assume that a family that had previously
been taxed on their contributions would now
choose not to contribute. V
In other words, Congress's desire to partici-
pate may result in a family not contributing
because they are afraid of being taxed on
their contributions. VI

Therefore, there comes a point at which
the tax deduction becomes less effective —
and so is less effective in its contribution to
the war effort. This is why it is important
for Congress to keep bylaws, V, to ensure
that contributions are given in spite of the
tax deduction. VI
