AN ACT TO CONSOLIDATE AND AMEND THE ACTS RESPECTING THE DUTIES OF CUSTOMS.

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

- 1. This Act shall be cited as "The Customs Tariff, 1894"
- 2. In this Act, and in any other Act relating to Customs, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - (a) The initials "n.e.s." represent and have the meaning of the words "not elsewhere specified";
 - (b) The initials "n.o.p." represent and have the meaning of the words "not otherwise provided for"
 - (c) The expression "gallon" means an Imperial gallon;
 - (d) The expression "ton" means two thousand pounds avoirdupois;
 - (e) The expression "proof" or "proof spirits" when applied to wines or spirits of any kind, means spirits of a strength equal to that of pure ethyl alcohol compounded with distilled water in such proportions that the resultant mixture shall at a temperature of sixty degrees Fehrenheit have a specific gravity of 0.9198 as compared with that of distilled water at the same temperature.
 - (f) The expression "gauge," when applied to metal sheets or plates or to wire, means the thickness as determined by Stubbs' Standard Gauge;
 - (g) The expression "in diameter," when applied to tubing, means the actual inside diameter;
