REPUBLICAN SENATOR ELOQUENT IN PLEADING WILSON'S CAUSE

Lodge, Who Strongly Urged Non-Partisan Support of Administration's Panama Policy, Was Applauded for Several Minutes by a Crowded Gallery.

WASHINGTON, April 9.—Hearing on the Panama Canal tolls exemption bill opened today before the senate committee, but interest in the repeal fight was focussed on the senate itself, where Senator Lodge, veteran Republican member of the foreign relations committee, held the attention of virtually the entire membership and of crowded galleries the more than two hours, defending the position of President Wilson in insisting upon the passage of the repeal bill. The senator spoke without a single interruption. He declared that in his opinion the right of the United States to exempt any of its shipping from tolls was unquestioned, but that the interpretation of the treaty, by which the country finds itself in its foreign relations, urged non-partisan support of Senator Lodge's address the galleries broke into applause and the president's name was pounded for several minutes before order was restored.
