

Spain Must Yield, Zola Says. New York, April 21.—A special to The World from Faris says: Emile Zola said to The World correspondent concerning the trouble between the United States and Spain: "My sympathies are with America and Cuba, but I should be sorry to see two great nations involved in bloodshed for so small a cause. I expect Spain to give way at the last moment. Spain has evidently not got the art of governing colonial pos-sessions, She must yield Cuba sooner or later."




Klondike Canoe.
