SONGER LANDS TO TO 1 2-YEAR-OLD.

Queen of Song the Only Favorite of the Day to Finish in Front.

New Orleans, Jan. 14.—The Crescent City Handicap for 3-year-olds and upwards, at 1 1/4 miles, valued at \$2000, was the feature of today's racing. Handse, who landed the last stake run, placed today's event to his owner's credit, Sailor King, who ran second to his stable companion in that event, finished absolutely last to-day, showing no special whatever.

SURGERY STOPPED THE SNEEZING

Reported at the District of Columbia Medical Society.

Washington, Jan. 15.—A remarkable physical phenomenon was reported to the Medical Society of the District of Columbia at its meeting last night by Dr. Walter A. Wells.

A girl 17 years of age began to sneeze while in the school room on October 1, and was uncontrollable. The teacher sent her to a drug store and the sneezing ceased for a few days.

Her mother, having tried all the ordinary remedies, called a physician. He prescribed sedatives, such as opium, and a small amount of chloroform, but the sneezing still went on.

A consultation was held and it was decided to give the patient chloroform. While she was unconscious the sneezing stopped, but as soon as she awoke it began again.

It continued regularly night and day without cessation, until a surgical operation was performed on the nose, which the doctors believe caused the irritation. Dr. Wells undertook its removal by the use of electric needles, and the sneezing stopped.

NEW STAMPED ENVELOPES

Are Now Being Turned Out at the Printing Bureau at Ottawa—Five for 11 Cents.

Ottawa, Jan. 15.—A very creditable piece of work is the new 2c stamped envelope being turned out by the Government Printing Bureau. The first few hundred were printed in purple, but, in deference to a general agreement among the nations belonging to the Postal Union, the issue is now being struck off in red.

The stamped envelope is entirely the product of the Bureau being manufactured there throughout and embossed on a printing press which Superintendent McMath has had specially constructed for the purpose.

Both as to stock and workmanship it compares favorably, he it said to the credit of the Bureau, with the best quality of stamped envelopes supplied in any part of the world, and, as the stamped envelopes are being sold at the rate of five for 11c, it is likely they will come into very general use.

THE BELGIUM WILL FIGHT BOOZE.

Government to Introduce a Bill Lessening the Number of Bars in That Country.

Brussels, Jan. 15.—Efforts in opposition to the increase of alcoholism in Belgium hitherto have been left for the most part to private initiative, and they have made little progress, although often patronized by the Government.
