INTERIOR DEPARTMENT TREATED ALL ALIKE

No Discrimination in the Leasing of the Western Timber Limits.

Ottawa, Jan. 31.-The Opposition today continued to indulge in its favorite pas-

time of scandal-hunting. Messrs. McCarthy, Heron and Perley were the principal speakers for the Conservatives, while Dr. McIntyre and Mr. Miller (South Grey) spoke for the Government, the latter especially making a most effective reply to the charges. He defended the sale of limits to Mr. Burrows, M.P., on the ground that he was a practical lumberman, and therefore on the same footing with any other in the business, so far as the Government was concerned. He also pointed out that the Government treated Liberals and Conservatives alike in allotting berths, and showed very clearly that the entire ad-

ministration of the interior department was above reproach. Mr. Perley said unfair conditions sur-rounded the disposal of the limits situated in Goose, Namiew and Amiak Lakes district, apout 100 miles north of Lepas, the present terminus of the Canadian

Northern. The berths, he said, consisting of 125 square miles in this district, were disposed of in the dead of winter. The tenders were advertised for on Jan. 28, and bids had to be in by March. They fell into the hands of the Saskatchewan Land Company for \$13,125. It is said that the company has offered to sell at \$3,000 per square mile, or \$375,000 for the berth. On the same dates, he said, the department advertised and disposed of square miles of timber from 50 to 100 miles northwest of Prince Albert. were berths Nos. 1048 and 1049, and included 175 townships. Berth 1048, which consisted of 250 square miles, was the first choice of that district. Berth No. 1049 was second choice. The first was secured by the Big River Lumber Cor pany, about which little is known, for \$5,000. The company had five and a half years in which to locate the land, ninetenths of which is on the other side of the Saskatchewan watershed. Its present valuation is approximately half a million dollars. The second berth went to J. H.
