

HERE'S A POSER FOR BOTH MAGISTRATE AND LICENSE INSPECTOR

Is It Legal To Remove Liquor Willied You by Friend.

As the bonds of prohibition are drawn tighter and tighter the keys that give access to many well-filled cellars are being more sparingly used, so much so that one elderly Londoner declared Friday that when he died he expected that there would still be a large supply of cheer-giving fluid left in his cellar for his heirs and benefactors.

One of the benefactors mentioned immediately got in touch with License Inspector J. E. Keeney, asking if it would be legal to go into his friend's house after his demise and help himself to his share of the contents of the cellar.

This was indeed a poser for the good inspector. He did not know, and immediately passed his question on to Magistrate A. H. M. Graydon.

"I never heard of such a case, and I could not tell you offhand whether the O. T. A. provided for a contingency of that description," said Mr. Graydon, when appealed to.

He thought that possibly the family could divide the contents of the cellar between themselves, providing a special permit was obtained. There was provision for the sale of liquor under a sheriff's sale, but in the case of a cellar full of whiskey he was not prepared to make any comment without looking into the question more closely.

One lawyer questioned declared that he would see to it that his family got no opportunity to fight over the contents of his cellar, for by the time he died there would be nothing to fight over.

"However, I wouldn't be a bit surprised if there were many good hard legal battles in the future over the disposal of a well-filled cellar," he concluded.

SAYS "MOVIES" TEND TO AMERICANIZATION OF THEATRE-GOERS

"So many motion pictures shown in this country are American that the people of the Dominion are becoming Americanized and denationalized by them," Rev. Dean Tucker told the Social Service Council at the Y. M. C. A. on Friday night.

This statement was made during a general discussion on motion pictures and vaudeville. There was not such objection to the motion pictures served to the Ontario public as there was to the vaudeville. There was a censorship of the films, but not of the vaudeville acts. The councils of the province would have to cope with the matter at the root. The theatre men apparently did not have much choice in the acts. It was those who sent them out to the theatres who were responsible.

James Gray, K. Casselman, T. D. McCullough, Mrs. John G. Peever and Mrs. Harrison were appointed as a committee to ascertain where the acts were shown.

In every province there was a board of censors. E. A. Peacock thought that this was a mistake and that these time boards should be replaced by a Dominion board. This would be the investment of Canadian capital in Canadian film manufacturing.

To get to the bottom of the causes of the lamentable conditions under which many people in this city exist, the council appointed G. A. Peacock, W. E. Kelly, J. F. Thomson, Miss Smith, Mrs. York Miller, Mrs. Harrison, Mrs. Crockett and Raymond Smith. This committee will report at the next council session.

The Social Survey. T. D. McCullough, speaking with reference to a social survey, said that in this city there were a great many residents who were not citizens, but were of foreign birth. They generally lived in very poor surroundings. Back of the existing conditions was a generating condition. To help make these alien good citizens, it was necessary that a survey of them first be made. Then work would have to be done to remedy the evil. There was a great deal of missionary work to be done right in this city, the speaker declared.

Miss Smith, the social welfare nurse, had found many children neglected in homes of native-born citizens, as well as in the dwellings of foreigners. In these homes children who went to work in factories when but 14 years of age were reared. They were married when very young, and raised children who in turn followed in their footsteps. Miss Smith was of the opinion that there were very distinct slum conditions in London.

W. E. Kelly, inspector of the Children's Aid Society, said that he often had been called regarding putting children in some institution on account of the environment in which they lived. Their homes were not tidy. When Mr. Kelly met the persons who furnished him with the information, they submitted to him that they had not been in to help the family complained of, for fear of getting themselves dirty. It was not provisions and other charities, but the helping hand that these people needed.

Dean Tucker and Dr. R. G. Peever agreed with the last speaker. Their churches had persons in their parishes doing this work, but there were many ill-kept houses in the city that were not visited.

The original committee appointed by the council on this work numbered but three. However, J. F. Thomson asked that labor delegates be appointed on the committee, and so more names were added.

An Economic Question.

The question was an economic one as well as one of environment, if one wished to go to the root of it, Mr. Thomson remarked. He thought that labor men should be on the committee.
