

The Acting Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Charles Drury, announced today that Canada will be represented at the second 1970 Meeting of the Conference of Ministers of Education of French-speaking countries of Africa and Madagascar, which will take place in Paris from April 6-10. The Canadian delegation will include representatives of Quebec, New Brunswick, Ontario and Manitoba as well as federal government advisers.
