To Perpetuate Unionist Party As a Political Organization

Formal Call Is Issued For Caucus on Thursday, At Which a Platform Will Be Submitted For Ratification.

Ottawa, March 9.—A formal call has been issued for the Unionist caucus next Thursday morning at 10 o'clock. It is understood that the government will propose making the Unionist party a permanent political organization, possibly under the name suggested by Sir Thomas White of the National Liberal-Conservative party. A platform will be submitted for the ratification of the caucus, which, it is understood, has been submitted to and approved by the cabinet. Assistance will be given by the government that Sir Robert Borden is improving in health and will resume his seat in the house of commons before the close of the session.

PARLIAMENT WITNESSES N. W. ROWELL AND C. MURPHY IN LENGTHY, BITTER DEBATE

Former Secretary of State Makes Many Charges Against Rowell—Reads From Secret Orange Circular—Crowded House When President of Privy Council Speaks in Reply.

Ottawa, March 9.—The day was marked by a bitter duel between Hon. Charles Murphy, former secretary of state in the Laurier administration, and the Hon. N. W. Rowell, president of the privy council. It began a few minutes after the house opened in the afternoon, and did not close until 9.30 in the evening. Word of the debate came round, and there were many in the chamber when Mr. Murphy rose to speak. But their number was small compared with the crowds which jammed the galleries in the evening. Not a seat was vacant—official and public galleries alike were packed, and from this side or that of the house were constant outbursts of cheers and laughter.

ROYAL CERTIFICATES FOR TWO MINISTERS

Right Hon. C. J. Doherty and Sir Thomas White Become Privy Councillors.

Ottawa, March 9.—The royal certificate of appointment as members of his majesty's privy council was presented today to Right Hon. C. J. Doherty, minister of justice, and Sir Thomas White, former minister of finance, at a luncheon at Government House. In presenting the certificates, his excellency the governor-general remarked that the call to the imperial privy council was the highest honor his majesty could bestow on any of his subjects. This was the one honor which could come from no one else but the King, and the new councillors must be sworn by the King himself. In the case of the new Canadian members of the privy council, they will be sworn on their next visit to England.
