**PRIZE FIGHTS AND EDUCATION**  
(Toronto Star)  
The contrast in the degree of interest taken by the public in the Dempsey-Gibbons prize fight and the world's educational conference at San Francisco has recently perplexed the Christian Science Monitor, which wired to four large American cities to find out much had been given in the newspapers to the two events. In New York, Chicago, Washington and Philadelphia, twenty-three newspapers gave 2788 columns of space to the prize fight and a total of 4.94 columns to the educational conference. These figures lead to a number of questions. Did the newspapers correctly estimate the relative interest in the two events? Is it the newspapers' business to go counter to public sentiment in such matters? And is the great interest taken in sporting events something creditable to the people?

A prize fight is not a ladylike affair, and it may develop features that appeal to the lower primal instincts. The spectacle of two huge humans trying to batter one another into a state of helplessness in return for a fortune is not elevating. But a world's champion was to be a fine specimen of a man, physically, with strength, agility, courage, striking force, skill, fortitude and endurance.
