IS DEAD IN BOSTON

Boston, Mass., Nov. 25—(By Associated Press)—Dr. C. Herman Miller, well-known Boston physician, died here on Thursday night. He was born in Riehtown, N. B., 59 years ago, and graduated from New York University medical school in 1891. Death was due to pneumonia following blood poisoning from an infected finger. He is survived by his wife.

MEXICAN SHOE INDUSTRY

STOCK EXCHANGE DEFENDED. London, Nov. 6.—(A. P., by mail.)—
Lecturing at the School of Oriental Studies, Professor H. S. Forwell defended the Stock Exchange from a charge brought by many people that it was little better than a gambling hell. MEXICAN SHOE INDUSTRY

New York, Nov. 25—According to a recent report of the Canadian Bureau of Statistics, the value of the minerals produced in the Dominion in the first six months of this year amounted to \$57,682,944, a decrease of little more than \$7,000,000 from the corresponding period in 1921. This shewing, according to the Canadian Bank of Commerce, in a review of the industry, may under the circumstances, be considered highly encouraging, for there has been a much greater output of gold, silver and lead, and the actual decrease in coal and in copper and nickel are more than accounted for by labor conditions in one case and depressed markets in the other.

The production of gold amounts to 585,833 fine ounces, valued at \$12,110,-100.


