### LOCAL NEWS

The regular monthly meeting of the  
Coal Handlers' and Trimmers' Union,

of Japan. He will take up marine work  
ashore.

completed by April 25. Only two re-  
cruits, G. M. M. steamers are to come here  
under the winter schedule, namely the  
Canadian Hunter and the Canadian  
Gunner, both of which are expected during the week to load

### THAMES TRAGEDIES.

London, April 14 - Unable to obtain  
work since he was demobilized from the  
National Defence Corps in 1919, Ste-  
phen Ashley, sixty, formerly a musician,  
suffered from delusions. These became  
more marked after his wife's death, and  
having once attempted to take his life  
by cutting his throat, he drowned him-  
self in the Thames at Putney Bridge.  
"Suicide while of unsound mind" was  
the verdict at the inquest at Fulham.
