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BIG CHIMNEYS A FALSE IDEAL, SAYS HON. M. W. DOHERTY

Declares Increased Production Is Solution of Troubles

Hon. Manning W. Doherty, before a Canadian Club audience at the Refectory in Queen Victoria Park, Niagara Falls, the other night gave an excellent address on the importance of cultivating a Canadian national spirit. He dealt with the problems of rural depopulation, and outlined what he intends doing by immigration and by a system of rural credits, to be introduced at the next session of the legislature.

"An attempt has been made," he said, "to sow dissension between the farmers and the city people, unfortunately without success. It has been said that the farmers are antagonistic to city interests. While in minor interests they may not be identical, yet there is never antagonism of interests, but in the past we have been following a false god. We have believed that big smokestacks spell happiness and prosperity, and industry has developed ahead of agriculture. The only hope for prosperity is the full development of agriculture side by side with industry. The solution of all our troubles is increased agricultural production."

The Drift From Farm to Town.

the whole population lived in the towns and 70 per cent in the rural sections. Today the position is reversed. The 70 per cent now live in the towns."

Mr. Doherty spoke of the farm surveys which have been made, and the attempt to get the farmers to install a regular bookkeeping system. He claimed

ed that on a 100-acre farm in 1918 the farmer and his wife made only 30 cents an hour, based on results of these surveys. The majority of them were making less than \$1,000 a year. That is the reason for the drifting of the men from the farms.

The people who will be hardest hit by lowered production will be city people. The farmer will always grow enough to feed himself. The world is in a much more serious condition as regards food supply than it has ever been. Before the war the world stock of food was only six weeks ahead of the need. Matters are much worse now. The only way, he claimed, to get rid of our foreign indebtedness is to take it out of the soil.

Plan to "Increase the Shoulders." "My duty is to decrease the load by increasing the shoulders," he spoke in favor of a system of carefully "fitted" immigration. Offices have been opened in London, will be opened in Dublin when the trouble is over, and also in Norway, Sweden and Denmark, where the immigrants will be picked. Mr. Doherty announced that he will make a tour of Great Britain and other parts of Europe this year in the interests of this immigration.

Speaking of education, he quoted the saying, "The leader of education stretches from the little red schoolhouse to the University in the city." "The trouble is the boy stays in the city," he said. "That is going on all the time. The rural districts must be put on an equal basis, economically, socially and educationally."

In conclusion, Mr. Doherty spoke of the importance of developing a unity of purpose. "Intolerance must be uprooted. We realize today as never before that we are our brothers' keepers. The time will come when success will not be counted by the amount of capital amassed, but by the service rendered to our fellow men. Let us tolerate the opinion of the other fellow as long as he respects our laws."

SAYS WESTERN COAL MINES CAN SUPPLY EAST

Report That Prairie Producers Market All Own Product Is Denied—Depends on Freight.

Calgary, July 15.—The statement of "a leading coal merchant" in Montreal, contained in a Canadian Press despatch from that city, that the mines in the West "already market all their own product" as an instance in the opinion of coal operators and others here, of the deliberate campaign on the part of the eastern people to keep the western product out of the eastern market.

"The actual facts are that the domestic coal mines in Alberta, owing to lack of orders, are at the present time working to only about 25 per cent of their capacity. This particularly applies to Drumheller, the largest domestic coal producing district of the Province," a dealer said.

When the despatch mentioned was sent to W. F. McNeil, the Secretary of the Western Coal Operators' Association, this official at once referred to Drumheller as a case in point where lack of orders was the cause of the present limited output. The Montreal merchant persons in the east to go to Ontario and Quebec, allowing the western coal to take care of markets from the Great Lakes west.

TEMPERANCE CONVENTION IN RAILWAY CITY

National Division, Sons of Temperance Delegates Hear Excellent Reports of Work of Order.

Moncton, N. B. July 14.—With the large attendance of delegates from various parts of Canada, United States, Great Britain and Ireland, the seventy-sixth annual convention of the National Division Sons of Temperance of North America, opened this morning, in the First Baptist church here with Most Worshipful Patriarch E. L. G. Hopenthal, of South Manchester (Conn.), in the chair.

The reports of the most worthy patriarch, Mr. Hopenthal, most worthy scribe, Ross Slack, of Philadelphia; most worthy treasurer, W. C. Adams, of New Brunswick (N. J.), and the most worthy patron, W. A. Tice, of Toronto, were submitted.

The most worthy patriarch in his report told of renewed efforts during the year to launch the campaign for \$40,000 which will be placed in a permanent fund, the interest from which will be used for propagation work. This drive was organized before the war and \$19,000 raised. During the war the campaign was suspended.

At the afternoon session Mr. and Mrs. William Mees brought fraternal greetings from 400,000 British and Irish Sons of Temperance. The order there is fifth of the friendly benefit societies. British Sons of Temperance was planted in 1847 at Liverpool by two American sailors. Its first national charter, January 1, 1855, was signed by Leonard Tilley of this province.

The war service honor roll, as far as available to date, was read by the national scribe. Eleven of the thirteen grand divisions had reported as follows: New Brunswick, in service, 142; died, 24; Nova Scotia, in service, 483; died, 46; wounded, 25; P. E. Island, in service, 20; died, 11; wounded, 14; Ontario, in service, 261; died, 22; Newfoundland, in service, 18; died, 1. The patron's report showed Bands of Hope with ninety-three members in New Brunswick. There are 12,792 members active in North America in thirteen grand divisions and 292 divisions.
