was, since we are the oldest democracy in the world.

The country is inhabited almost exclusively by a homogeneous set of Arabs, all descending from a common stock, while the foreign element is infinitesimal, certainly smaller than in any other country I know of. There are only about 5000 Turkish soldiers in the Turkish population in a land containing three and one-half million Arabs. Why, then, should not the Arabs rule the country where they live and have lived for countless generations? Why should we not be masters in our own house?

The prince then explained that the provinces they claimed were Hedjaz, Syria, Upper and Lower Mesopotamia, Yemen and Nejd. He made it clear that he was here officially only as the representative of the kingdom of Hedjaz. Arab Unanimous.

"But he added, 'I am also the representative of the whole Arab army, which was recruited from each and all of these states, and I can truthfully say that the Arabs are unanimous in claiming their independence.

"If the peace congress should doubt this statement, or lend ear to the rumors that Syria prefers the French, or Palestine the British, let them send a commission to investigate. If they find that any portion of Arabia would prefer to be ruled by China, Japan, Chile or any other power, then I shall not have another word to say.

"As a small struggling nation we have already done much. King Hussein, my father, commonly called 'the grand old man of the East,' declared war against Turkey when she was at the height of her military glory, and invited volunteers to his standard. Soon quite a considerable army collected, which under my personal leadership inflicted on the Turks a series of defeats culminating in the taking of Medina last week.

"The Arab army acted as the British right wing, and in the last offensive, in addition to taking 40,000 prisoners, by a rapid march cut the Turkish line of retreat, enabling the British to capture 70,000 more.

"Can Govern Themselves.

"The two usual objections made to our ambitions," continued the prince, "are: 'Have your people reached a high enough standard of civilization to govern themselves?' and 'will you have enough money to carry on your state?'

"To the first, I unhesitatingly say 'yes.' The world must not forget that it is Arabs who largely govern the country at this very moment, and all over the world Arabs have shown their worth as merchants and administrators. There must be some six or seven thousand Arabs fighting in the American army, as there are about 250,000 Arabs in America.

"As for the second question, I also answer in the affirmative. Our country is a rich one. It contains large quantities of copper, iron, minerals, oils and a little coal, while when properly irrigated, it is one of the most fertile in the world. I think, if I am not wrong, I tempt capital, and we intend to welcome all foreigners who come with the intention of investing capital or teaching us something. The only stipulation we make is that there shall be no intrigue, no foreign control, but complete freedom for the Arab."
