Ann Arbor, Mich., Jan. 8—Blind from birth, with his conception of the heavens formed by descriptions from others, Joseph Caldwell of Indiana, Patrance, Bishop Manning and others, Joseph Caldwell of Indiana, Patrance, Bishop Manning of the studying astronomy at the University of Michigan in order that he may meet the scientific requirements to permit him to be graduated from the College of Literature, Science and Arts.
