In obedience to your letter of May 28<sup>th</sup> last, in regards to taxation on the Indian Reserve of Caughnawaga, and in regards to the ruling that the owners of the Co-operative store will not be required to file the form in question.

I am now writing again, as I have not heard from you again in the above matter.

I wish to bring to your attention of our latest trouble, apparently some power company is again building a power line through our Reserve without the consent of the Band nor Council. As it is today there are already 3 power lines on our Reserve which have taken and laid to waste a large portion of our lands, so we now feel that we cannot permit any other power-line or roads etc to run through our Reserve. No doubt the Indian Agent knows what's going on while we are in ignorance of the fact. Kindly bring this matter up with the proper
