A Message from his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, acquainting the House that his Excellency was then in the Chair, and desired the Attendance of the House at the Council Chamber.

The House waited on his Excellency, who was pleased to give his Assent to the following Bills, viz.

A Bill intituled " An Act to prevent the Robbing of Gardens and Orchards, Potatoe and Turnip Fields, and the throwing down of Fences, and for amending an Act made and passed in the twentieth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act for preventing Trespasses by unruly Horses, Cattle, and Sheep, and for preventing the running of Hogs at large through the Town of Charlotte Town."

A Bill intituled " An Act to render valid Conveyances of real Estates of married Women by them made, or to be made, during their Coverture."

A Bill intituled " An Act for repealing two several Acts, that is to say, an Act made and passed in the twenty-first Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act for the Preservation of High-Ways ; also an Act made and passed in the twenty-fifth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act to explain and amend an Act made and passed in the twenty-first Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for the Preservation of High-Ways."

A Bill intituled " An Act to prevent disorderly Persons from taking and riding or using the Horses of others, without their Leave or Permission."

A Bill intituled " An Act for appointing Commissioners of Sewers."
