

BEITH, ROBERT (*West Durham*).

Father and mother were natives of Campbelltown, Argyleshire, Scot., where the family were engaged in milling and farming, and came to Canada, in 1835. B. in the Tp. of Darlington, Ont., and ed. at the Public Schools and at a private school in Bowmanville. Took a course at a Commercial Coll. in Toronto. Unmarried. Is a farmer and an importer of thoroughbred horses. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1891, and re-elected at g. e., 1896. A Liberal.—*Bowmanville, Ont.*

BELOOIRT, NAPOLEON ANTOINE (*Ottawa City*).

B. in Toronto, 15 Sept., 1860. Ed. at St. Joseph Seminary, Three Rivers, and at Laval Univ., where he graduated in Law with honors in 1882. Practiced law in Montreal for two years, and was then called to the Bar of Ontario in 1884, when he removed to Ottawa to practise. M., 29 Jan., 1889, Hectorine, dau. of Hon. Joseph Shehyn, Quebec. Is a mem. and Secretary of the Law Faculty of Ottawa Univ.; Presdt. of the Liberal Reform Club, Ottawa, and Vice-Presdt. of the Ontario Liberal Association. Was County Attorney and Clerk of the Peace for the Co. of Carleton, from June, 1894, to June, 1896. An unsuccessful candidate at g. e., 1891. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1896. A Liberal.—*Ottawa; Rideau Club.*

BELL, ADAM CARR (*Pictou*).

Father was a native of Scotland: mother a Nova Scotian, of English descent. B. at Pictou, N.S., 11 Nov., 1847. Ed. in the schools of New Glasgow, Sackville Academy, and at the Univ. of Glasgow. M., 4 Sept., 1873, Annie, dau. of John Henderson, Albion Mines. Is in business as a druggist. Has been a School Commr. and Warden of New Glasgow. Sat in the House of Assem., N.S., from 1878 to 1887, when he resigned and was an unsuccessful candidate for Pictou in the House of Commons. Was a mem. of the Executive Council, and Provincial Secretary in the Thompson Administration, until the resignation of that Govt., July, 1882, after which he was leader of the opposition, until 1887. First returned to House of Commons at g. e., 1896. A Liberal Conservative.—*New Glasgow, N.S.*
