

Served as a Volunteer officer during the rebellion, 1837, and in following year raised a regiment for active service, for which he received the thanks, in district orders, of Maj.-Genl. Sir Jas. McDonnell, and in general orders, of Lieut.-Genl. Lord Seaton. Served as extra Aide-de-Camp to Earl of Gosford, then Gov.-Genl., 1837. Appointed Deputy Quarter-Master General of Militia, 1840; extra Provincial Aide-de-Camp, to Gov.-Genl., same year; Provincial Aide-de-Camp. 1850; acting Adjutant-General of Militia in attendance on H. R. H. the Prince of Wales during his official tour in Canada, 1860, and for his services on that occasion received the thanks of H. R. H. and the Gov.-Genl.; and principal Aide-de-Camp. to Gov.-Genl., 2 Oct., 1868. (Salary \$1840.) *King St. Ottawa.*
