

conviction and the holding of such Sessions of the Peace next thereafter, and provided that within three clear days after the making of such conviction, exclusive of Sundays and Holidays, such Appellant shall enter into a recognizance with two sufficient sureties before any one Justice, conditioned to try such appeal without any unnecessary delay, and to abide the judgment and to pay all costs to be awarded on such appeal.

DIVERS PROVISIONS.

16. The provisions of the Act, chapter one hundred and three of Chap. 103 of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada "respecting the duties of Justices of the Peace out of Sessions in relation to summary convictions and orders" in so far as the same are respectively applicable, shall extend and apply to cases under this Act.

17. All penalties and forfeitures recoverable under this Act and accruing to Her Majesty, shall be paid to the Receiver General of this Province, and form part of "The Liquor Inspection Fund."

18. With a view to meet the expenditure to be incurred under the provisions of this Act, it is enacted that over and above the duties and fees now payable under the authority of any law, each and every tavern-keeper shall pay *one dollar*, which shall form part of the Liquor Inspection Fund, and which sum shall be payable to the Collector of Inland Revenue, and by him paid over, with other moneys coming his hands, to the Receiver General.
