Q. How long would you wait before you would start back home?

A. When we catch lots of fish, why then we come right back.

Q. What did the other Indians do about the fishing, besides yourself? A. Just the same---they done the same.

Q. Did you ever take out any logs or wood from those Islands?

A. Give it again?

Q. Did you take out any logs or timber of any kind? A. I took out some timber for my own use.

Q. How far back does that go, when you started to take out timber for your own use? A. From the time I was with my father up till now---ten years ago.

Q. And since ten years ago, you felt you were not as young as you were, eh? Now, you told us your father built ships. Did he build anything else? A. He built a barn.

Q. Where did he get the timber to build his barn---Oh, first tell us where the barn was? A. Christian Island.

Q. And where did he get the timber? A. He got the cedar for the shingles from Hope Island.

Q. He did not get anything from Beckwith Island to build his barn? A. A little pine along the shore.

Q. From Beckwith, for his barn? Did any of the other Indians get anything from Hope or Beckwith for their buildings? A. Yes, I know when they were building their homes.

Q. How far back does your recollection go when the Indians were doing that? A. Ever since I could remember. From when I was about 14 years of age up to the present time.

Q. Did you know an Indian by the name of Show-khan? A. He was my uncle.

Q. Where did he live? A. He lived on Christian Island but he had a farm on Beckwith Island.
