Dear Sir,-

Referring to official letter of the 19th ultimo, asking you to trace up the disposition made by William Johnson, soldier settler, of lumber supplied to him by the Department, I beg to say that the Department has ascertained that this lumber was traded for other lumber used in building a house on Johnson's lot. As this house has been transferred to Earl Sands, who has taken over Johnson's loan, the value is on the farm and the matter of tracing up the lumber may be dropped. However, I would ask you to look into the matter of the disappearance of the horses which were supplied to Johnson by the Department.
