schemes suggested in Dr. Tory's report, or a composite scheme formed out of all his suggestions. There is a clause you will note providing that such legislation shall be subject to co-operation from the Provinces. This, I think, is an excellent safeguard.

Finally I would respectfully ask you to concur in this course which I have taken as I assure you I did it wholly in the interests of the party and under circumstances which, I fear, had nothing been done of this character, might have resulted in the cementing of the Progressives, before the session, with the Liberals under the leadership of Mackenzie King.

I am making a memorandum of some other matters which can wait until you return. Everything has been going very smoothly and nothing, I think, has suffered up to the present, and, as Dr. Tolmie and Sir Henry Drayton will be here, I am leaving in a day or two for home.
