April 26, 1930

May 28, 1930

No. 33 West 44th Street was purchased for the future growth of the Club from a syndicate of members who had generously held it at the Club's disposal.

January 18, 1933

Annual dinner—a farewell to President A. Lawrence Lowell, '77, with Bishop Lawrence, '71, and Franklin D. Roosevelt, '04, President-elect of the United States, the other speakers.

January 25, 1934

Annual dinner—a greeting to President James Bryant Conant, '14.

September 1, 1934

Total membership of the Club was 5,291, including three honorary members (A. Lawrence Lowell, '77, James Bryant Conant, '14, and Franklin D. Roosevelt, '04), 227 life members, 2,510 resident members and 2,551 non-resident members.
