Blinds are also required for the windows and these you may supply.

I may add that it has been decided to dispense with Mr. Crain's services at this school and to secure, take if possible, a qualified and efficient teacher to charge after the summer holidays. Kindly state what accommodation there is for either a married or single teacher.
